"TRANSFORMING PUBLIC EDUCATION: BALANCING INNOVATION WITH EVIDENCE"

Few would argue that public education must be an important part of addressing some of our greatest challenges. At no time in our history has the need been more acute for innovation to improve education. These innovations must at the same time improve classroom instruction and engage leaders and communities to improve the likelihood of schools' effectiveness. Efforts to improve educational outcomes must be coupled with an intense focus on employing research methodologies to determine which innovations are effective and when. This talk will illustrate how the faculty of the Simmons School of Education at SMU are building a culture of evidence-based educational practice in the preparation of teachers and school leaders and will focus on a specific community-university partnership designed to end poverty by improving educational access and outcomes.

David J. Chard, Ph.D. is the Leon Simmons Endowed Dean and founding dean of the Annette Caldwell Simmons School of Education and Human Development and Professor in the Department of Teaching and Learning at Southern Methodist University. His research and teaching interest are in early literacy and mathematics instruction for struggling students and communities. He has been a classroom teacher in California, Michigan, and in the U. S. Peace Corps in Lesotho in southern Africa. In October of 2011 Dr. Chard was nominated by President Barack Obama to serve on the Board of Directors of the National Board for Education Sciences, a 15-member board that advises and consults with the director of the Institute of Education Science.





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
